## MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a state prisoner, alleges that in denying his application to proceed in forma pauperis, the subject United States District Judge “gave no logical reason for imposing a strike” for the purposes of 28 U.S.C. § 1915(g) “other than the court’s history of dismissing every case based upon no investigation of the facts.” He further asserts that the judge is “corrupt and self-motivated” and “is part of the [region’s] District Court Chain of Criminal Conspirators seeking to impose their agenda to protect the cities [sic] Corporations paying them for protections” and “covering up for Republican Party crimes.”

To the extent that these allegations relate directly to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling, they are subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). In other respects, any assertions of conspiracy, corruption, and bribery appear entirely derivative of the merits-related charges, but to the extent the allegations are separate, they are wholly unsupported, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) as “lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred.”

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.


