MEMORANDUM


Complainant, a state prisoner, alleges that the subject United States District Judge's adverse rulings in three prisoner civil rights proceedings and, in particular, his failure to find that the indictment underlying complainant's conviction was defective, violated complainant's Thirteenth Amendment rights and violated the judge's Oath of Office to support the Constitution.


The allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's decisions and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

This is complainant's fourth merits-related complaint, and his third such complaint against the subject judge, and he has been warned previously against filing further merits-related, conclusory, and/or frivolous complaints. Complainant's right to file complaints is hereby SUSPENDED pursuant to Rule 10(a), Rules For Judicial-Conduct or Judicial-Disability Proceedings. complainant may show cause, through a petition for review submitted pursuant to Rule 18, why his right to file further complaints should not be so limited.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
