

MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a federal prisoner, complains that subject United States Circuit Judge “violated my statutory, civil, constitutional, and human rights by allowing federal judges to commit crimes and by refusing to address my petitions for review in violation of 28 § U.S.C. 331.” Despite being given an opportunity to provide further information in support of these claims, complainant declined to do so.

Such vague and conclusory allegations are insufficient to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352 (b)(1)(A)(iii).

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
