
MEMORANDUM

In a largely unintelligible judicial misconduct complaint, *pro se* litigant complainant alleges that the subject United States Magistrate Judge has engaged in “erroneous behavior ... on unlawful and contrary acts ... by rendering a contested objection for response on [REDACTED] Original Complaint”, and has thereby deprived him of due process.

The allegation relates directly to the merits of the magistrate judge’s decisions, and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
