MEMORANDUM


Complainant, a federal prisoner, complains of the subject United States District Judge and Senior United States District Judge, two of several federal judges who have dismissed complainant's numerous lawsuits asserting that prison officials are stealing large checks that are allegedly being sent to him.

Complainant asserts that both judges committed judicial misconduct and "illegal activity" by dismissing his suits, because his suits are "accurate and meritable." He further contends that Judge A was a business partner of the half-brother of complainant's immediate family member, and that Judge A therefore showed favoritism toward the prison-official defendants. Complainant requests that his case be "found meritable" and reinstated, that the defendants be "impeached and prosecuted," and that "every person involved" be required to take a polygraph test.

The complaints that the judges dismissed complainant's cases are subject to dismissal as related to the merits of their decisions under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). Complainant's other allegations are frivolous, nonsensical, and unsupported, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
