### MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a private citizen, complains that there has been an "eleven year delay" in judicial action by the subject United States District Judge in a 28 U.S.C. § 2254 proceeding. He alleges that such undue delay in judicial action is "prejudicial to the effective and expeditious administration of the business of the courts." After the complaint was filed, the subject judge entered final judgment in the case. Review of the docket indicates that prior to issuing the opinion, the subject judge had taken no action in the case for eight years.

Although an eight-year delay in judicial action is inexcusable, it does not, of itself, constitute judicial misconduct. Pursuant to Rule 4(b)(2) (formerly Rule 3(h)(3)(B)) of the Rules For Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings, an allegation about delay in rendering a decision or ruling is not cognizable misconduct "unless the allegation concerns improper motive in delaying a particular decision or habitual delay in a significant number of unrelated cases." As complainant does not allege the former, and there is insufficient evidence of the latter, the complaint is subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
