
MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a federal prisoner, complains that in denying complainant's application to proceed in forma pauperis, the subject United States Magistrate Judge "dismissed [the lawsuit] without authority" and "violated 28 U.S.C. § 636 for censorship in violation of my First, Fifth (all aspects), and Eighth Amendment Rights."

The complaint relates directly to the merits of the magistrate judge's decision, and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.


ORDER
