MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a pro se litigant, complains that despite explaining that the defendants “will stop at nothing to deprive [me] of [my] rights ... by sending out fake orders from the court,” the subject United States District Judge denied his motion for a hearing to validate the court’s signatures on orders and “[didn’t] give an explanation or reasoning for the orders [sic] just a flat-out denial.”

The complaint relates directly to the merits of the judge’s decision and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

This is complainant’s second merits-related judicial misconduct complaint in two weeks regarding the same proceeding. Complainant is WARNED that should he file a further merits-related, conclusory, frivolous, or repetitious complaint his right to file complaints may be suspended and, unless he is able to show cause why he should not be barred from filing future complaints, the suspension will continue indefinitely. See Rule 10(a), Rules For Judicial-Conduct or Judicial-Disability Proceedings.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.


ORDER
