MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a civil litigant, complains that the subject United States District Judge “granted [the defendant’s motion for] summary judgment, denied [my] motion to reconsider, and denied [my] motion [for] fraud upon the court, all without allowing [me] to be heard or having a fact finding or evidentiary hearing ... [or] to challenge the only [defense] witness,” and thereby violated complainant’s constitutional right to due process.

The complaint relates directly to the merits of the judge’s decisions or procedural rulings and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.


ORDER
