MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a plaintiff in pending civil litigation, complains that during settlement conferences, the subject United States Magistrate Judge made patently false statements, "assigned guilt" [to him] without holding a trial, engaged in verbal abuse including threatening judicial action, and physically assaulted complainant's attorney, which in turn caused fear she would assault complainant.

The allegations pertaining to patently false statements, assignation of "guilt" and verbal assault in the form of "threatening judicial action" relate directly to the merits of the magistrate judge's decisions or procedural rulings and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. ' 352(b)(1)(A)(ii).

As to the allegation of physical assault, a limited inquiry was conducted pursuant to Rule 11(b) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings, and I find that the allegations lack sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred. This allegation is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal process of appellate review, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of decisions or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
