MEMORANDUM

Complainant, a pro se litigant, has filed a complaint alleging misconduct by the subject United States District Judge.

Complainant has provided a copy of an article which discussed the judge's legal career prior to taking the bench. The article stated that many years after a now-retired District Attorney spoke to the judge's high school class, the judge worked as an assistant district attorney alongside the District Attorney, prosecuting a case that was significant to the judge's legal career. Based on that statement, complainant concludes that the judge has a "lifelong friendship" with the District Attorney's family and should therefore have recused sua sponte in complainant's case in which the District Attorney's relative is a defendant.

Complainant further asserts that the judge's order dismissing his federal suit was "shocking and discriminating against [the] average citizen," and that he was making a constitutional challenge to a statute and the judge should have certified that supposed challenge to the State Attorney General.

These allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's rulings and implied decision not to recuse sua sponte, and are therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
