#### M E M O R A N D U M

Complainant, a pro se litigant, has filed a complaint alleging misconduct by the subject United States District Judge in complainant's civil rights proceeding.

Complainant alleges that the judge "violated [my] constitutional rights by denying [me] the right to a Notice of Appeal, denying [me] the right to change of venue, denying [me] the right to transfer [my] case from state to federal court on the grounds of diversity and violation of constitutional rights," and "by erroneously labeling [me] as a frequent filer of frivolous lawsuits" and "threaten[ing] me with possible sanctions." She further asserts that the judge's erroneous decisions constitute evidence of "a disability in the accurate research and review of cases" and "review of court information."

To the extent that these allegations relate directly to the merits of rulings and procedural decisions, they are subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). In other respects, any assertion of disability appears entirely derivative of the merits-related charges, but to the extent the allegation is separate, it is wholly unsupported, and is therefore subject to dismissal under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii) as "lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that [the judge is suffering from a disability]."

Judicial misconduct proceedings are not a substitute for the normal appellate review process, nor may they be used to obtain reversal of a decision or a new trial.

An order dismissing the complaint is entered simultaneously herewith.
