

CLERK'S ANNUAL REPORT JULY 2018 - JUNE 2019 **PREFACE**

This report provides information on the judicial business of the United States

Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit for the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30,

2019.

Our statistics refer to both "appeals" and "cases." The term "appeals" refers to

all filings reported to the Administrative Office. This includes additional appeals,

cross appeals, consolidated appeals, successive habeas corpus, paid and in forma

pauperis mandamus applications, and petitions for review. The term "cases" refers

to actual workload credit. An example would be a main appeal with a cross appeal.

We count this as two "appeals," but only one "case" because the court works on the

main and the cross appeal together. Statistics counting "cases" provide a more

accurate and realistic picture of the actual workload of our judges.

A. <u>NEW FILINGS</u>

1. New Appeals Filed

The chart below compares the "new appeals" to the national average. We experienced a 183 appeal decrease (2.5%), from 7347 to 7164 appeals. Successive habeas petitions increased by 6 (1.2%). Criminal appeals increased by 39 (1.8%). Federal question appeals decreased by 124 (17.0%); prisoner appeals decreased by 165 (7.7%).






Table 3 - 2019 New Appeals by Case Type

Our biggest increase in filings was in Criminal and BIA appeals. Prisoner and Federal Question appeals dropped significantly.

3. New Appeals

Four of the nine districts showed an increase in appeals filed. Eastern Texas increased the most and Eastern Louisiana decreased the most. Other appeals (Agency, Bankruptcy, U.S. Tax Court, BIA, and Mandamus) increased by 43 cases.

Table 6 – 2018 New Appeals





Table 7 – 2019 New Appeals



B. <u>CLOSED APPEALS</u>

1. <u>Yearly Comparison</u>

The court disposed of 10 less **appeals** this year, a decrease of 0.1%.

2. Method of Disposition

Overall, the court disposed of 47 fewer cases than last year. There were 20 more opinions, and other judicial dispositions decreased by 77. Clerk dispositions increased by 10.




Table 10 - Method of Disposition by Graph

C. <u>UNDISPOSED OF (PENDING) APPEALS/CASES</u>

The court disposed of 7377 **appeals** compared to 7164 filed. There are 4633 appeals pending compared to 4848 last year. There are 3862 **cases** pending this year compared with 4111 last year.

1. <u>Cases Under Submission</u>

Excluding cases consolidated for argument and decision (12), and held in abeyance by the judges (17), the pending cases argued and awaiting decision decreased from last year.

2. <u>Unassigned Carry-Over</u>

All cases briefed but not yet argued or decided and all unbriefed cases are reported as "Unassigned Carry-Over" (see Table 14 for details). Unassigned cases decreased, 243 fewer than last year. This leaves 3658 cases that are the immediate future workload of the court. The following chart gives the six-year trend for unassigned carry-over:




1. Number of Opinions, Published and Unpublished

Table 17 - Number of Opinions, Published and Unpublished by Graph




2. Types of Opinions

3. Types of Opinions by Calendar

The types of opinions on the summary, oral argument and conference calendars are as follows:

(a) Summary Calendar

The number of summary calendar decisions decreased by 365 from 1607 to 1242. The percentage of signed opinions on the summary calendar increased by 0.5% while per curiam opinions decreased by 1.3%.

Signed opinions on the oral argument calendar increased this year by 3.2%. Per curiam opinions decreased by 3.9%.





Table 24 - Per Curiam Opinions Number and Percentage



Table 26 - Published Opinion Percentage Comparison by Graph






The 2019 reversed/vacated rate of 8.1% is greater than the 7.2% reversed/vacated rate in 2018.

F. WORKLOAD PER ACTIVE JUDGE

1. Opinion Output - Per Active Judge

The average opinion output for each of the active judges who participated in disposing of cases on the merits on the summary, oral argument and conference calendars for the reporting year from July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019 decreased by 9 cases over last year.



3. Overall Workload

The average opinions per active judge does not give a complete measure of the active judges' overall workload. Participation in other panel members' opinions in fully briefed cases, conference calendar panels, Augean conference panels, as well as consideration of petitions for rehearing en banc and administrative-interim motions are also other important work factors. Overall, active judges handled 182 fewer matters per judge than last year. **Enclosure B**, page 29, shows the total average annual workload per active judge, based on the court's summary calendar, seven sessions of court per active judge, and other workload figures as follows:



H. EN BANC PETITIONS AND REHEARINGS

The court received 190 petitions for en banc rehearing, an increase of 15 from the prior year (175). Parties requested en banc rehearing in 6.6% of the cases with opinions. The court acted upon 193 petitions for en banc rehearing and 12 petitions remained pending at the end of the year. The court denied requests for rehearing en banc in 181 cases, 4 of which were after a poll. The court granted five petitions for rehearing en banc by the parties. 

J. <u>ADMINISTRATIVE-INTERIM MOTIONS</u>
