<u>ORDER</u>

On March 25, 2020, in General Docket Order No. 2020-4, the court extended by 30 days the filing deadlines for incarcerated and nonincarcerated prose filers. After the expiration of that extension, the court learned that measures being taken by the Federal Bureau of Prisons, Louisiana Department of Public Safety & Corrections, Mississippi Department of Corrections, and the Texas Department of Criminal Justice in response to the ongoing pandemic are preventing or significantly impacting the ability of incarcerated prose filers to comply with filing deadlines.

Accordingly, the court directs the clerk's office to extend deadlines in appeals filed by incarcerated pro se filers by an additional 30 days. This order does not extend the time to file a notice of appeal or a petition for review. *See* FED. R. APP. P. 26(b).

All previous changes ordered in General Docket Nos. 2020-3, 2020-4, and 2020-5 remain in effect. This order continues until rescinded.
