APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE ELECTRONIC PUBLIC
ACCESS FEES BY CHRISTINE BAILEY

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Christine Bailey for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds that Christine Bailey, an individual researcher associated with the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption. Additionally, Bailey has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information. Accordingly, Bailey shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of researching how attorneys frame arguments to help judges arrive at their decisions. Bailey shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- I. this fee exemption applies only to Bailey, and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- II. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- III. by accepting this exemption, Bailey agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- IV. Bailey is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via internet-based databases;
- V. this exemption is valid until August 25, 2025.
