APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE ELECTRONIC PUBLIC
ACCESS FEES BY KRISTIAN HURT

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Kristian Hurt for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds that Kristian Hurt, a student enrolled in the Paralegal program at the University of New Hampshire, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption. Additionally, Hurt has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information. Accordingly, Hurt shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of researching criminal cases associated with individuals involved in the Connecticut river murders in New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Maine, Virginia and Florida. Hurt shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- I. this fee exemption applies only to Hurt, and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- II. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- III. by accepting this exemption, Hurt agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- IV. Hurt is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via internet-based databases;

V. this exemption is valid until October 17, 2024.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
