Melvin Oliver James, Jr., appeals from his sentence imposed following the revocation of his supervised release. He argues that the district court did not make an informed decision when it imposed his sentence to run consecutively to the federal sentence James was serving at that time. The record does not support James's argument.

James has failed to show that his sentence was in violation of law or plainly unreasonable. See United States v. Rodriguez, 23 F.3d 919, 920 (5th Cir. 1994). Accordingly, the district court's judgment is AFFIRMED.
