Ramiro Rangel appeals his sentence following a guilty plea conviction for one count of bank fraud. Rangel argues that the district court abused its discretion in making an upward departure under § 2B1.1 of the Sentencing Guidelines. Rangel also asserts that the extent of the upward departure is unreasonable.
