Ignacio Barrera Perez, Jr., appeals the sentence he received after pleading guilty to conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute marijuana and conspiracy to participate in an illegal racketeering enterprise. He argues that his base offense level should have been reduced for the role he played in the conspiracy and that the court failed to consider his age, family responsibilities, military service, or employment record when it
