PER CURIAM:*

Cyrill Athanasios Kolocotronis, who resides at the Missouri State Mental Hospital, appeals the district court's dismissal of his 42 U.S.C. § 1983 civil rights complaint as frivolous. The district court did not abuse its discretion in adopting a magistrate judge's finding that Kolocotronis' allegations, which describe a government plot to spread the AIDS virus throughout the world, were "fantastic" and "delusional" and therefore

frivolous. See Kolocotronis v. Club of Rome, No. 3:96-CV-0070-H (N.D. Tex. Aug. 21, 1996). Kolocotronis' appeal is without arguable merit and is frivolous. See Howard v. King, 707 F.2d 215, 219-20 (5th Cir. 1983). Because the appeal is frivolous, it is DISMISSED. See 5th Cir. R. 42.2.
