PER CURIAM:*

Jacqueline Pruett appeals the district court's order granting summary judgment for the defendants. Pruett contends that the defendants violated her substantive and procedural due process rights in suspending her employment as a public school teacher and in refusing to renew her annual contract. We have carefully reviewed the briefs and the record. Essentially for
