In this case, the plaintiff alleges no basis for a claim of denial of constitutional due process. His pleadings reflect that he is essentially dissatisfied with the result of the disciplinary proceedings. In addition, he alleges only in the most general terms that the defendants' decisions violated his rights (which were undescribed) and that the decisions were against the weight of

the evidence. These allegations do not rise to the level of stating a section 1983 claim, and such bare allegations do not require a Spears' hearing to develop the claim. See Spears v.
