Ronald Darnell Wordlaw, Arizona prisoner # 58949, appeals the district court's dismissal as frivolous of his civil rights complaint against various officials in Texas and, by amendment, various officials in Arizona. Wordlaw alleged that his extradition from Texas to Arizona was improper, and he makes similar arguments on appeal.
