Ct. 2531 (2004), Oscar Luis Marquez-Gomez argues that the district court erred by imposing a sentence based on facts that were neither admitted nor found by a jury beyond reasonable doubt. The Government has moved for summary affirmance in lieu of filing an appellee's brief because the issue is foreclosed in this circuit under <u>United States v. Pineiro</u>, No. 03-30437, 2004 WL 1543170, at *1 (5th Cir. July 12, 2004). The issue is indeed foreclosed. The
