PER CURIAM:\*

Douglas M. Cruz pleaded guilty to reentering the United

States illegally after having been deported and after having been

convicted of an "aggravated felony," a violation of 8 U.S.C.

§ 1326(a) and (b). The district court sentenced him to a

51-month prison term and to three years of supervised release.

For the first time on appeal, Cruz argues that 8 U.S.C. § 1326(b) is unconstitutional under <u>Apprendi v. New Jersey</u>, 530 U.S. 466 (2000), because it does not require the fact of a

prior felony or aggravated-felony conviction to be charged in the indictment and proved beyond a reasonable doubt. As Cruz concedes, this argument is foreclosed by <u>Almendarez-Torres v.</u>

<u>United States</u>, 523 U.S. 224 (1998), and <u>Almendarez-Torres</u> was not overruled by <u>Apprendi</u>. <u>See United States v. Dabeit</u>, 231 F.3d 979, 984 (5th Cir. 2000).

Cruz also argues that the Supreme Court's holding in <u>Blakely v. Washington</u>, 124 S. Ct. 2531 (2004), should be applied to sentences determined under the United States Sentencing Guidelines. He concedes that this argument is foreclosed by this court's opinion in <u>United States v. Pineiro</u>, 377 F.3d 464, 465 (5th Cir. 2004), <u>petition for cert. filed</u> (U.S. July 14, 2004) (No. 04-5263), but he raises it to preserve it for possible further review.
