Joel Gonzalez, federal prisoner # 63438-079, appeals the denial of his 28 U.S.C. § 2241 petition. He argues that his sentence is invalid in light of <u>United States v. Booker</u>, 543 U.S. 220 (2005). Gonzalez's argument is directed toward a sentencing error; such an argument may not be brought under § 2241. <u>See</u> <u>Padilla v. United States</u>, 416 F.3d 424, 425-26 (5th Cir. 2005). Gonzalez's argument that he is entitled to proceed under § 2241 based on the savings clause of 28 U.S.C. § 2255 because relief under that section is "inadequate or ineffective" is unavailing.
