Appealing the judgment in a criminal case, Mario Arturo DelaGarza presents arguments that he concedes are foreclosed by *United States v. Daugherty*, 264 F.3d 513, 518 (5th Cir. 2001), which rejected a Commerce Clause challenge to 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(1), and *United States v. Dancy*, 861 F.2d 77, 81-82 (5th Cir. 1988), which held that a conviction under § 922(g) does not require proof that the defendant knew that the firearm had an interstate nexus or that he was a felon. The Government's motion for summary affirmance is
