PER CURTAM:*

Jesus Francisco Morales-Agustine (Morales) appeals the 80-month sentence imposed following his guilty-plea conviction of illegal reentry into the United States after being deported.

Morales contends that his sentence is illegal under <u>United</u>

<u>States v. Booker</u>, 543 U.S. 220 (2005), because it was imposed pursuant to a mandatory application of the United States

<u>Sentencing Guidelines</u>. He thus alleges a "Fanfan" error. <u>See</u>

<u>United States v. Walters</u>, 418 F.3d 461, 463 (5th Cir. 2005).

Fanfan error is not a structural error. <u>Id</u>. However, the

Government concedes that the <u>Fanfan</u> error was preserved, so we review for harmless error. <u>See id.</u> at 464. The Government has failed to carry its burden of showing beyond a reasonable doubt that the district court's Fanfan error had no effect Morales's sentence. <u>See id.</u> We therefore vacate the sentence and remand for resentencing in accordance with <u>Booker</u>. <u>See id.</u>

Morales contends that the sentence-increasing provisions of 8 U.S.C. § 1326(b) are unconstitutional and that this court should remand his case for resentencing to no more than two years in prison under 8 U.S.C. § 1326(a). As he concedes, this contention is foreclosed by <u>Almendarez-Torres v. United States</u>, 523 U.S. 224, 235 (1998).

CONVICTION AFFIRMED; SENTENCE VACATED; REMANDED FOR RESENTENCING.
