The Federal Public Defender appointed for Lionel Jones has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief pursuant to <u>Anders v. California</u>, 386 U.S. 738 (1967). Our review of counsel's brief, Jones's response, and the record discloses no nonfrivolous issues for appeal. We decline to consider Jones's claim of ineffective assistance of counsel in this direct appeal, without prejudice to Jones's right to assert such claim in a motion pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2255. <u>See United States v.</u>
