PER CURIAM:\*

Manuel Villanueva appeals from his conviction of transporting illegal aliens. He contends that the district court erred by adjusting his offense level based on his intentionally or recklessly creating a substantial risk of death or serious bodily injury, pursuant to U.S.S.G. § 2L1.1(b)(5). Villanueva seeks leave to file a supplemental brief in which he contends that the adjustment violated <u>Blakely v. Washington</u>, 124 S. Ct. 2531 (2004), because it was based on facts that were not charged in his indictment, were not found by a jury beyond a reasonable

doubt, and were not admitted by him at his plea hearing. The motion to file it is GRANTED.

The district court's finding that Villanueva had used heroin shortly before driving was not clearly erroneous. <u>See United</u>

<u>States v. Humphrey</u>, 104 F.3d 65, 71 (5th Cir. 1997). Villanueva correctly concedes that his <u>Blakely</u> contention is foreclosed by <u>United States v. Pineiro</u>, 377 F.3d 464 (5th Cir. 2004), <u>petition</u>

<u>for cert. filed</u> (July 14, 2004) (No. 04-5263).

AFFIRMED; MOTION GRANTED
