PER CURIAM:\*

Ronald D. Kelly, federal prisoner # 15592-064, appeals the district court's dismissal of his 28 U.S.C. § 2241 petition.

Kelly pleaded guilty in the Western District of Oklahoma to possession with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance. His § 2241 petition challenged the constitutionality of his sentence in light of <u>United States v. Booker</u>, 543 U.S. 220 (2005).

On direct appeal, Kelly's sentence was vacated under <u>Booker</u>, and the matter was remanded for resentencing. <u>United States v.</u>

<u>Kelly</u>, 159 F. App'x 864, 867-68 (10th Cir. 2005). As Kelly has received all of the relief he was seeking in his § 2241 petition, his appeal is moot. <u>See McRae v. Hogan</u>, 576 F.2d 615, 616-17 (5th Cir. 1978). Accordingly, this appeal is DISMISSED as moot.
