James Stephen Jones, a federal prisoner (# 56081-080), appeals from the district court's order granting the summaryjudgment motion filed by defendant Willie Roberts. In 1999, this court had affirmed the court's granting of a motion to dismiss by several other defendants and remanded for further proceedings solely with respect to a retaliation claim against Roberts. Jones v. Greninger, 188 F.3d 322, 327 (5th Cir. 1999).

Jones argues that he has demonstrated a "chronology of events" that established that Roberts intended to retaliate against him for Jones' filing of a grievance against a sincedismissed defendant, Yolanda Cornelius. Jones' allegations suggest little more than that, on the same day he filed the grievance, Roberts told him that he was being reassigned to a new prison job. Jones' assertions, even if assumed to be true, remain too conclusional to establish that Roberts was acting in retaliation. <u>See Woods v. Smith</u>, 60 F.3d 1161, 1165 (5th Cir. 1995). He has failed to show that a genuine issue of material fact remains with respect to his retaliation claim against Roberts. <u>Celotex v. Catrett</u>, 477 U.S. 317, 325 (1986); <u>Whittaker</u> <u>v. BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc.</u>, 206 F.3d 532, 534 (5th Cir. 2000).
