Gustavo Gonzalez-Guerrero ("Gonzalez") appeals his conviction for illegal reentry after deportation, pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1326. He contends that the district court erred in denying his motion to suppress the evidence of his prior deportation, in which he argued that his prior deportation proceedings violated his right to due process. He also contends that his sentence should be vacated because the Government did not allege his prior felony conviction in the indictment.

Gonzalez concedes that the issues raised in this appeal are foreclosed by this court's decision in <u>United States v. Benitez-</u> <u>Villafuerte</u>, 186 F.3d 651, 657-58 (5th Cir. 1999), <u>cert denied</u>, 528 U.S. 1097 (2000), and the Supreme Court's decision in <u>Almendarez-Torres v. United States</u>, 523 U.S. 224, 235 (1998), and that he raises the issues solely to preserve them for review by the Supreme Court. This court affirms the judgment of the district court.
