PER CURIAM:*

Yassin Sheik Hamud is a native of Somalia who attempted to enter this country in May 1999 with a fraudulent passport. This fraud was discovered, and removal proceedings were instituted against him. He conceded deportability and sought asylum, withholding of removal, and, in the alternative, voluntary departure. After conducting a hearing, an immigration judge denied all of his claims and ordered him removed from the United

States. The Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) dismissed Hamud's appeal pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 3.1(d)(2)(i)(D) because he failed to file a brief or statement after indicating that he would do so in his notice of appeal. Hamud now petitions this court for review of the BIA's decision. Hamud has failed to brief, and has thus waived, the central issue whether the BIA erred in summarily dismissing his appeal. <u>See Strong v. BellSouth Telecomms. Inc.</u>, 137 F.3d 844, 853 (5th Cir. 1998). Because he has waived this issue, he has not shown that the BIA erred in relying on 8 C.F.R. § 3.1(d)(2)(i)(D) to summarily dismiss his appeal. Accordingly, his petition for review is DENIED.
