Jesus Coronado-Pineda appeals his guilty-plea conviction for illegal reentry into the United States after deportation. For the first time on appeal, Coronado-Pineda argues that the sentencing provisions of 8 U.S.C. § 1326(b)(1) & (2) are unconstitutional in light of <u>Apprendi v. New Jersey</u>, 530 U.S. 466 (2000). Coronado-Pineda acknowledges that his argument is foreclosed by <u>Almendarez-Torres v. United States</u>, 523 U.S. 224 (1998), but he seeks to preserve the issue for Supreme Court

review. <u>Apprendi</u> did not overrule <u>Almendarez-Torres</u>. <u>See</u> <u>Apprendi</u>, 530 U.S. at 489-90; <u>United States v. Dabeit</u>, 231 F.3d 979, 984 (5th Cir. 2000). Accordingly, the judgment of the district court is affirmed.
