PER CURIAM:*

Nico Benn appeals the district court's denial of his 28 U.S.C. § 2241 petition which challenged his post-removal-order detention by the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). The district court did not err in denying the petition. <u>Gisbert</u> <u>v. United States Attorney General</u>, 988 F.2d 1437, 1440 (5th Cir. 1993), <u>amended by</u> 997 F.2d 1122 (5th Cir. 1993). Benn's postremoval-order detention was authorized under 8 U.S.C.

§ 1231(a)(1)(C). Benn's incomplete and conflicting statements to the INS hampered the INS's ability to effectuate removal and served to extend the removal period of 8 U.S.C. 1231(a)(1)(A). <u>Balogun v. INS</u>, 9 F.3d 347, 350-51 (5th Cir. 1993). The judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED.
