PER CURIAM:*

Juan Jose Macias-Castro ("Macias"), federal prisoner #79463-080, appeals the district court's dismissal of his motion to dismiss the indictment, which was filed after his conviction was affirmed on appeal and after time for seeking a writ of certiorari had expired. Because the criminal proceedings were no longer pending, this motion was unauthorized and without a jurisdictional basis. See United States v. Early, 27 F.3d 140,

142 (5th Cir. 1994). Macias has thus "appealed from the denial of a meaningless, unauthorized motion." <u>Id.</u> Accordingly, the appeal is DISMISSED.
