Walter Alberto Mejia-Ruiz (Mejia) appeals his sentence following his guilty plea conviction for illegal reentry. He argues that the district court reversibly erred under <u>United</u>

States v. Booker, 543 U.S. 220 (2005), by sentencing him pursuant to a mandatory application of the Sentencing Guidelines. The Government concedes that Mejia has preserved this issue for appeal. The Government, however, has not shown beyond a reasonable doubt that the error was harmless. <u>See United States</u>

<u>v. Walters</u>, 418 F.3d 461, 463-64 (5th Cir. 2005). Accordingly,
Mejia's sentence is vacated, and this case is remanded for resentencing.
