PER CURIAM:*

Randy Phillips, federal prisoner # 04954-043, appeals the dismissal of his 28 U.S.C. § 2241 petition, in which he challenged his sentence of 151 months of imprisonment for his 1998 conviction of conspiracy to distribute a controlled substance. Phillips contends his sentence is unconstitutional in light of <u>United States v. Booker</u>, 543 U.S. 220 (2005), and <u>Blakely v. Washington</u>, 542 U.S. 296 (2004), because it was based on facts that were not set forth in his indictment or proven beyond a reasonable doubt.

Phillips' claims based on alleged errors that occurred at sentencing may not be asserted in a § 2241 petition. See Padilla v. United States, 416 F.3d 424, 425-26 (5th Cir. 2005). Phillips' claims based on allegations that he is entitled to proceed under § 2241 are unavailing. Id. at 426-27.
