Michael J. Frischenmeyer, Texas prisoner # 698940, moves for a certificate of appealability (COA) to appeal the denial of his 28 U.S.C. § 2254 petition. In that petition, Frischenmeyer challenged the Texas Parole Board's refusal to grant him release on parole. Frischenmeyer was released on mandatory supervision on May 9, 2006.
