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did not satisfy its burden of showing, on the facts of this case, that suitable employment for Necaïse was "reasonably available" because Necaïse was able to perform short-term light duty work. See *Norfolk Shipbuilding & Drydock Corp. v. Hord*, 193 F.3d 797 (4th Cir. 1999).
