Jose Luis Aldaba-Roman appeals his conviction and sentence for illegal reentry after deportation, as well as the revocation of the term of

supervised release he was serving at the time of the offense. He argues that 8 U.S.C. § 1326(b) is unconstitutional because it allows a sentence above the otherwise applicable statutory maximum of two years of imprisonment and one year of supervised release based on facts that are neither alleged in the indictment nor found by a jury beyond a reasonable doubt. Because Aldaba-Roman does not address the validity of the revocation or the revocation sentence, he has abandoned any challenge to them. *See Yohey v. Collins*, 985 F.2d 222, 224-25 (5th Cir. 1993).

Aldaba-Roman has filed an unopposed motion for summary disposition and a letter brief correctly conceding that the issue is foreclosed by *Almendarez-Torres v. United States*, 523 U.S. 224 (1998). *See United States v. Pervis*, 937 F.3d 546, 553-54 (5th Cir. 2019). He explains that he has raised the issue only to preserve it for possible further review. Accordingly, because summary disposition is appropriate, *see Groendyke Transp., Inc. v. Davis*, 406 F.2d 1158, 1162 (5th Cir. 1969), Aldaba-Roman's motion is GRANTED, and the district court's judgments are AFFIRMED.
