The entry of Homero Trevino's guilty plea waived all but jurisdictional defects, including his right to challenge the denial of his motion to suppress evidence. <u>United States v. Smallwood</u>, 920 F.2d 1231, 1240 (5th Cir.), <u>cert. denied</u>, 111 S.Ct. 2870 (1991); <u>United States v. Benavides</u>, 793 F.2d 612, 618 (5th Cir.), <u>cert. denied</u>, 479 U.S. 868 (1986). Trevino's conviction and sentence are, therefore, AFFIRMED. In light of the disposition of this appeal, Trevino's challenge to his incarceration during the pendency of the appeal is moot.
