PER CURIAM:¹

Reyna appeals the dismissal of his action seeking relief under Title VII and §§ 1981 and 1983 against the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, Institutional Division (TDIC), its Director, James Collins and others. The district court dismissed the action following a bench trial. The court rendered detailed findings of fact and conclusions of law giving detailed reasons for its

conclusion that plaintiff failed to show that defendants discriminated against him.

The only significant issues Reyna presents on appeal are challenges to the district court's findings. Unfortunately, Reyna has not provided this court with a transcript of the trial. This makes it impossible for this court to review Reyna's arguments that the evidence does not support the district court's findings. The failure of an appellant to provide a transcript is a proper ground for dismissal of the appeal. **See Richardson v. Henry**, 902 F.2d 414, 416 (5th Cir. 1990). Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed. APPEAL DISMISSED.
