Ealum Lee Stearman appeals the March 10, 1993 ruling of the district court which denied his motion for a stay, pending disposition of a 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion, of the court's order that he report to prison on March 12, 1993 to begin serving his sentence. Stearman immediately appealed that ruling and made an

emergency filing with this court. On March 11, 1993 a panel of this court denied Stearman's motion for relief from the trial court's order to report to prison on March 12, 1993. On April 15, 1993 that panel denied Stearman's request for reconsideration which he had advanced as a suggestion for rehearing en banc. On July 15, 1993 the same panel denied Stearman's motion for a mandamus ordering the district court to revoke its orders directing him to report to begin serving his sentence of imprisonment.

The appeal noticed by Stearman on March 10, 1993 has been definitively resolved. Accordingly, this matter is DISMISSED.
