Because Texas prisoner Guy Johnson's suit does not allege a constitutional violation, the magistrate judge did not abuse his discretion by refusing to appoint counsel. <u>Ulmer v. Chancellor</u>, 691 F.2d 209, 213 (5th Cir. 1982); <u>Jackson v. Cain</u>, 864 F.2d 1235, 1242 (5th Cir. 1989). For the same reason, Johnson's request that this Court appoint appellate counsel is DENIED. Ulmer, 691 F.2d at 213.
