PER CURIAM:*

Pro se plaintiff-appellant Elsie L. Risby sued her employer, the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, along with several other defendants, alleging discrimination under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended. The district

court granted summary judgment in favor of all defendants. We have carefully reviewed the briefs, the record excerpts, and relevant portions of the record, and for the reasons stated by the district court in its order of August 12, 1994, we are satisfied that the decision of the district court was correct. Even reviewing Risby's case in the most favorable light and considering her pro se status, we hold that she has not raised a genuine issue of material fact as to her discrimination allegations.

Accordingly, we AFFIRM the judgment of the district court.
