We affirm the summary judgment granted on Susan Oliver's ERISA claim for the reason stated by the trial court: Susan Oliver has not discredited BancTexas's legitimate reason for discharging her. The various state law claims she asserted in the district court are not briefed before this court and are considered waived.

Oliver argues that the motion for summary judgment was briefed before her supervisor was deposed. The testimony she cites does not suffice to raise a fact question about the bank's motive.
