PER CURIAM:\*

Wilfred Guy argues that his sentence for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon is unlawful because his prior conviction under California Penal Code § 245(a)(1) was not punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year. <u>See</u> U.S.S.G. §§ 2K2.1(a)(4)(A), 4B1.2(1), 4B1.2, comment. (n.3). Even though Guy was sentenced under a clause in § 245(a)(1) that provides for no more than one year incarceration in the county

jail, a conviction for violating § 245(a)(1) is punishable by up to four years imprisonment.

The Ninth Circuit has held that a violation of § 245(a)(1) is punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year. <u>United States v. Horodner</u>, 993 F.2d 191, 194 (9th Cir. 1993). Even without <u>Horodner</u>, we would reach the same conclusion because, except in the case of ambiguity, a statute's meaning is based on its plain language. <u>United States v. Denson</u>, 588 F.2d 1112, 1117 (5th Cir.), <u>rev'd en banc on other grounds</u>, 603 F.2d 1143 (5th Cir. 1979). "Punishable" means capable of being punished. <u>Id</u>. at 1116.

By the plain language of § 245(a)(1), a California assault with a deadly weapon was capable of being punished by four years imprisonment. The fact that Guy's actual sentence was more lenient than the maximum is irrelevant to the Guidelines calculation.

AFFIRMED.
