Reginald I. Bailey has refused to file an appellant's brief in this matter. His appeal is dismissed for want of prosecution pursuant to 5th Cir. R. 42.3.

Additionally, the district court imposed sanctions on Bailey for filing frivolous lawsuits. This Court has warned Bailey that he would be subject to sanctions if he continued to file frivolous appeals. Accordingly, we impose a monetary sanction of \$105 on Bailey. Until he pays to the Clerk of this Court the

\$105 monetary sanction imposed, and to the clerk of the district court the sanction imposed by that court, Bailey will not be permitted to file any pleadings of any kind, either in the district courts of this Circuit or in this Court.

In addition, until further order of this Court, Bailey will not be allowed to file any civil rights action in any district court subject to the jurisdiction of this Court without first receiving the written permission of an active judge of the forum court, nor may he file any appeal in such a case with this Court without first securing the written permission of an active judge of this Court specifically allowing same.

APPEAL DISMISSED; MOTIONS DENIED; SANCTIONS IMPOSED. THE MANDATE SHALL ISSUE FORTHWITH.
